

# **The Virtue Project Proposal**

A Framework for Restoring Character, Connection, and Hope in Our Schools

## **Overview**

The Virtue Project is a **non-religious, community-wide educational initiative** designed to weave character-building into the fabric of everyday school life. This project is not about adding another class or burdening teachers - it's about aligning the entire school community around **twelve core virtues** that every student can understand, embody, and carry into the world.

This is a call for unity. A call for courage. A call for character. And it's entirely possible.

## **The Problem We Face**

- Youth suicide and self-harm are at record highs
- Schools are overwhelmed by disruptive behavior
- Teachers feel burned out and unsupported
- Families are fractured and children feel unanchored
- Society increasingly lacks a **moral compass**

We produce students with knowledge, but not always wisdom - young people who may succeed academically but struggle to function relationally, ethically, or emotionally. We can - and must - do better.

## **The Vision**

Imagine if every student in grades K–12 focused on **one shared virtue every three weeks**—the same word, the same language, the same principles—reinforced in small but meaningful ways by teachers, peers, and even parents. By the time students graduate, they will have reflected on and practiced these 12 virtues annually, gaining deeper insight, stronger self-awareness, and improved decision-making skills.

## **The 12 Virtues (and Their Opposites)**

1. **Respect** vs. Disrespect
2. **Kindness** vs. Cruelty
3. **Responsibility** vs. Irresponsibility
4. **Perseverance** vs. Giving Up
5. **Courage** vs. Fear
6. **Honesty** vs. Deceit
7. **Compassion** vs. Indifference
8. **Self-Control** vs. Impulsiveness
9. **Humility** vs. Pride
10. **Gratitude** vs. Entitlement
11. **Forgiveness** vs. Resentment
12. **Wisdom** vs. Foolishness

## **What This Program Is Not**

- **Not religious:** Virtues are universal human values, not tied to any denomination or doctrine.
- **Not political:** It doesn't divide by beliefs - it unites by humanity.
- **Not complicated:** No new class required. No heavy training. It's simple, flexible, and scalable.

## **What We're Asking**

1. **Allow space** in the beginning of every school day for focused dedicated virtue training (e.g., a 15 minute reflection or story).
2. **Empower teachers** with flexible tools, not scripts.
3. **Encourage parental engagement** through brief take-home prompts or optional handouts.
4. **Promote community involvement** - businesses, mentors, and leaders modeling virtues too.
